Task Analysis:

- Choiceworks App (available on the app store, but I'm not sure if it is available on the play store) can be used to make visual schedules, visuals with a timer and what someone is waiting for, and feelings visuals (when I am *feeling* I can *blank* or *blank*). Comes with icons loaded in the app or you can take pictures to make your own icon. http://www.beevisual.com/
- First Then Visual Schedule HD by Good Karma Applications (available in App Store and for Android) it can be used to create a task analysis or visual schedule of the day's activities as well as choice boards. It allows you to add video or sound. The schedules can be printed out for hard copies from pdf.

Timers:

- **TimeTimer** (available on the app store and android market). Great visual timer for our students. <u>https://apps.apple.com/us/app/time-timer/id332520417</u> Note that while this is the official "TimeTimer" app, there are several similar apps on the store that are completely free of charge.
- Visual Countdown Timer a visual timer that allows you to set a picture to be gradually revealed as the timer runs. If the student is waiting for something specific, I like to set the picture to a visual representation of what the student is waiting for so they can visually see when it becomes "available". • **DayCape- Daily Visual Planner**. Allows parents/caregivers and students to create visual daily schedules to help keep the students on track, knowing what they are doing that day. <u>https://www.daycape.com/</u>

Fine Motor:

- Writing Wizard (available on App Store): provides tracing for pre-writing shapes and uppercase/lowercase letters that have eye-catching visuals. <u>https://apps.apple.com/us/app/writing-wizard-for-kids/id631446426</u>
- **Dexteria Jr** provides a beginning to pointing with 1 finger, working on pinching using thumb and index finger, and tracing within the lines. <u>http://www.dexteria.net/</u>
- **Jigsaw Puzzles** (available at retail stores i.e. Dollar tree, lucky, CVS) : Provides in hand fine motor manipulation as well as index finger strengthening by use of picking up the pieces with index and thumb. - Alphabet Wooden Blocks: (available in app stores) has puzzle shapes of alphabet letters to place the correct letter and also exercises for matching upper and lower case letters.
